








## Joseph Campbell

- Joseph John Campbell
- March 26, 1904 October 30, 1987
   (aged 83)
- Columbia University
- American mythologist, writer and lecturer
- "The Hero with a Thousand Faces"
- 12 steps of the hero's journey



"When you find a writer who really is saying something to you, read everything that writer has written and you will get more education and depth of understanding out of that than reading a scrap here and a scrap there and elsewhere."

#### The 12 steps of hero's journey

- 1. Ordinary world
- 2. The call of adventure
- 3. Refuse the call
- 4. Meeting the mentor
- 5. Crossing the first threshold 11. Resurrection of hero
- 6. Test, allies and enemies

- 7. Approach the inmost cave
- 8.Ordeal
- 9. Reward
- 10. The road back
- - 12.Return with elixir
