Multi State Objects (slideshow)

- 1. Window>Interactive>Object States
- 2. Place 4 pictures in to the document (command D)
- 3. Select all 4 (shift click)
- **4.** Select to **Convert selection to multi-state object** at the bottom Of the Object States Panel
- 5. Select all 4 (shift click)
- 6. Using the Align Panel and them top and left and move the to your Desired position
- 7. In the Buttons Panel you can control the slide show
- 8. You can use **Sample Buttons** from the pulldown menu in the buttons Panel
