


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

The chicken and the skunk. This was the first project I used spot colors. Before I took Graphic Design Basics, I had no idea what spot color was. Spot colors are a part of the Pantone Matching System (PMS) and not a part of the process colors (CMYK). For the assignment I was given two clipart files (the chicken and the skunk). Then I had to change each one to spot color. Then I was to bring it in InDesign and make a page layout, but still keeping it two spot colors for the whole layout. The reason for only using two spot colors is because it is cost effective for big printing jobs.

For the second part of the project I had to consider the layout of the text. As a class we learned to adjust leading, kerning, tracking, font size, and space after.

I work in a very symmetrical way so this assignment worked out well for me. Although, my goal since this project has been to stay away from being symmetrical. I improved by every assignment.



Early Morning

Typography is the means by which a written idea is given a visual form. The selection of the visual form can dramatically affect the readability of the written idea and a reader's feelings towards it due to the hundreds if not thousands of typefaces available. Typography can produce a neutral effect or arouse the passions, symbolise artistic, political or philosophical movements or express the personality of a person or organization.

Typefaces vary from clear and distinguishable letter forms that flow easily before the eye and are suitable for extended blocks of text to more dramatic and eye-catching typefaces that grab attention and are used in newspaper headlines and advertisements.

Typography is anything but static and continues to evolve. Many typefaces in use today are based upon designs created during earlier historic epochs. The fledgling printing industry established Roman capitals and Carolingian minuscules from the reign of Charlemagne as standard forms in the 15th century which are still widely used today.



Typography sets the tone of a piece of text and a typeface should be chosen that is appropriate and sympathetic to the message being presented and the audience being presented to. While there are no hard and fast rules, there are technical aspects to bear in mind that will help with typeface selection. This section will dissect the anatomy of a type face, provide examples of typefaces from the main classification categories and comment on their usability. As with many other elements of design, typeface selection is heavily influenced by the taste, style and personal preferences of the designer, together with current fashions, and is thus open to a great deal of experimentation.



When looking at my chicken layout you will notice that the text has big leading (the space between the lines) I did this to make the text legible. All my text is in one text box and then split in two columns. I put a farm on the bottom of the page by taking it from the chicken clipart and made a opacity so it was less visible then the text and use up some of that negative space.

Saving InDesign file as PACKAGE

You can gather the files you've used, including fonts and linked graphics, for easy handoff to a service provider. When you PACKAGE a file, you create a folder that contains the InDesign document, any necessary fonts, linked graphics, text files, and a customized report.

This report, which is saved in the default text editor format, includes the information in the Printing Instructions dialog box; a list of all used fonts, links, and inks required to print the document; and print settings.

You don't need to perform a final preflight check (see vocab) before packaging.

InDesign performs an up-to-date

preflight check. If problem

areas are detected, a dialog box

appears.

You can also give your service

provider a composite PDF file made from your document (see Producing Adobe PDF files for a high-resolution composite workflow) or a PostScript file (see Creating a PostScript

or EPS file). What is PDF Portable Document Format (PDF) is the standard for the secure and reliable distribution and exchange of electronic documents and forms around the world, with a ten-year track record.

PDF is a universal file format that preserves the fonts, images, graphics, and layout of any source document, regardless of the application and platform used to create it. Adobe PDF files are compact and complete, and can be shared, viewed, and printed by anyone with free Adobe Reader software.



This is the stinky skunk with purple and yellow spot color. After learning how to use text wrap I applied it to the skunk layout. I also duplicated the skunk clipart image in the back of the layout with opacity.





Bookmark




were about one inch big. The template below is for the bookmark layout including score marks and bleed.



First I found a font that look somewhat similar to the original, second I changed it to “Create outlines” which turns the letters into vector art, then thirdly I extended the “H” and “L” downwards.
