


Six people can have different ideas of the same thing, but once written it expresses the same for everybody.


Oral culture is an example of **Acoustic Space**.






Written Gulture








Tyrian purple, also known as Phoenician red, later on Imperial dye


Before the Alphabet: Pictographs

Before the phonetic alphabet existed, different ways of written communication existed. Hieroglyphics in Egypt preserved the spoken word







Shift away from Traditional Egyptian religion, that was Polytheistic


This idea was probably based on the Thebes god Amun: "the Hidden one"







Medieval book production in Europe Illuminated manuscripts



The Printing Press

The simplicity of the phonetic alphabet made it possible to use the Gutenberg's printing press (adapted from the Chinese printing press that was impossible to use because of the 20,000 characters in the Chinese ideographic alphabet).





The Chinese Printing Press gets to Europe




A small model of the original Chinese Press probably got to Italy as a present from the Kublai Khan to the Polo family of merchant/travelers from Venice and was brought back Marco Polo, in 1295, after 24 years of adventure.

Scientific findings were more easily accessible which made it easier for scientists to test each others theories, write about them, and then receive feedback
